# Attendance Update COVID-19

As I am sure you are aware, covid19 procedures are being updated daily. Currently we are being given advice from Birmingham City Council, DfE, Government, Unions, NHS, Public Health England and the World Health Organisation, to name but a few. At times there are conflicting advice and this can be quite confusing. Having shared these concerns with the relevant organisations and our MP, we are

putting the following procedures in place from Monday 21st September 2020.

\*If your child is showing symptoms [a new and consistent cough; a temperature of 37.8 or above; a loss of taste and smell] please book them for a test asap. They must then self-isolate for 14 days along with their siblings. If anybody in the household has symptoms, they should also have a test and the household self-isolate for 14 days. Please inform school either by telephone or email and do not send them to

school. After self-isolation or a negative test result, the children may return to school, a copy of the negative test result needs to be emailed to the school office. If there is a positive result, this should also be emailed so that the school can take protective measures.

\* If your child is showing symptoms of cold and flu, they do not need to self-isolate and do not need a test. Once they are feeling better, they can return to school.

#### **Umberslade Road**

We have been in contact with our local MP, PCSO, City Council, Park Rangers and the Highways Agency to try to make the Umberslade Road/ Oakdale entrance a little safer.

We put the police 'park it don't plonk it' leaflets on parked cars that were parked on the pavement outside of school, so that there is more space to walk past and a PCSO from Bournville also came to assess and confirmed that as a school we had done the right thing by opening this entrance and supported our request for the yellow zig zags to be reinstated, however as this is a public highway, it may take more than school to make this happen

quickly. Thank you to those parents who have offered to contact the council also.
I was able to speak to someone directly and have also requested:
\* that there is signage on the

- Raddlebarn Road/Umberslade Road junction to make drivers aware that there are school children crossing
- \* for cones or fencing to widen the pathway at busy times
- \* a lollipop lady or gentleman to help children and families cross safely

However, can I reiterate that we are still having to remind a small number of parents and families about safety before and after school for walking their children in the road, blocking the pavement, not social distancing and parking inappropriately. We all need to work together to keep everyone safe and I am very grateful for those who do adhere to the systems and safe practice.

A final reminder to come at your allotted time, we are still having some year groups arriving earlier than they should and this is also creating a hazard and unnecessary crowds.
