Our Reading Intent

We believe that a quality English curriculum should develop children's love of reading. We aim to inspire an appreciation of our rich and varied literary heritage, alongside developing a **habit of reading widely and often**, both for pleasure and information. We aim for all children to be able to read easily, fluently and with good understanding, in turn becomina enthusiastic and confident life**long readers**. Through phonics, we strive for children to learn to segment words to support their spelling ability and blend sounds to read words fluently and with ease. We believe that children need to develop a secure knowledge-base in English, which follows a clear pathway of progression as they advance through the primary curriculum. By the end of Key Stage 2, we aim for all children at Raddlebarn to acquire a wide vocabulary, and an understanding of grammar and knowledge of linguistic conventions for reading. We believe that a secure basis in English skills is crucial to a high-quality education and will give our children the tools they need to participate fully as a member of society.





We have been working alongside the Little Sutton English Hub as we continue to develop our reading provision.

Based on their recommendation, we have started to follow a new systematic synthetics phonics programme—

Little Wandle Letters and Sounds—to teach phonics in Early Years and Key Stage 1.

Year 5: Gillian Cross and Onjali Q Raif


Year 4: William Shakespeare and Michael Morpurgo
