



Commonwealth Day 2022

Commonwealth Day is an annual celebration observed by people all over the Commonwealth in Africa, Asia, the Caribbean and Americas, the Pacific and Europe.

As you will be aware our city is hosting the prestigious Commonwealth Games this summer too. This is a once in a lifetime opportunity and we wanted our children to feel part of it and remember this moment in time for the rest of their lives.

As a school we have a few things planned over the year which we are very excited to share with you.

Each class have been given a focus country from the Commonwealth to learn more about in depth. Work will take place to present and share their learning with others at a later stage. This will include information about key geographical features and climate, food and culture, flags and currency and plenty of fascinating facts.



Bring the Power workshops

The workshops will be a mixture of 1hour workshops for KS1 pupils and 1 ½ hour workshops for KS2 pupils that really engage and encourage pupils to learn more about the Birmingham 2022 Games through interactive activities focusing on the "Journey to the Games" and "Finding Common Ground". These will be led by visitors from the Commonwealth Games committee and may (fingers crossed) include a sportsperson from the Commonwealth Games itself.

Queen's Baton relay

Birmingham 2022 is staging the 16th official Queen's Baton Relay – an epic journey across the Commonwealth, with The Queen's Baton visiting all 72 nations and territories.

The Relay began on 7 October 2021, with Her Majesty The Queen placing her Message to the Commonwealth into the Baton. The Baton is now on its 294-day long journey to every corner of the Commonwealth.

This collective journey will ignite hope, solidarity and collaboration, as it connects communities embraces unique cultures and shares inspirational stories.

<u>Precious Emily – Stan's Café</u>

Precious Mckenzie became a weightlifting legend when, after an extraordinary childhood in apartheid blighted South Africa, he emigrated to England and won four consecutive Gold Medals in the Commonwealth Gold Medals.

Fifty years later, Emily Campbell stepped onto the Olympic stage and, in a moment described by The Guardian as "surely [the] most powerful, heart-warming and potentially life-changing story of these games", she lifted more than any British woman has ever lifted before.

Stan's Café are making a theatre show about these two wonderful athletes and the inspiration they give us when it comes to lifting up heavy things.

This will be an inclusive first bi-lingual show as, with the support and guidance of <u>DeafExplorer</u>, the cast mixes deaf and hearing actors. British Sign Language will be integrated into the performance with the aspiration that formal interpretation won't be required.

As an inclusive school, we were very excited to be involved and have been selected to have a funded place working with this company on developing this project. They will be working alongside our Y4 children in a series of workshops from now and until the summer term.

As if it couldn't get any better, posters of this show (that is open for bookings to the public), will have billboard posters around the city and the Commonwealth Stadium and the two children who modelled for the campaign.... Yes, they are from Raddlebarn and are proudly donning our uniform!

Commonwealth Connections

We have been successful in our application to be part of the Commonwealth Connections project. This is a joint project from the British Council and the Birmingham Organising Committee for the 2022 Commonwealth Games, running until July 2022, twinning 60 schools in the West Midlands with counterparts from the Caribbean, Sub-Saharan Africa and South Asia.

Raddlebarn has secured a place within the Arts partnerships and have been twinned with a school in Trinidad and Tobago! There are 6 other schools in our cluster who are also twinned with Trinidad and Tobago and together we will be working with a print maker (Anne Brierley) to create a wonderful Art exhibition in July of this year.

Throughout the project we will be doing lots of communicating and getting to know our partners through the form of school correspondence, digital postcards, questions about geography and culture and much, much more!
