At Raddlebarn Primary, we take a whole school approach to British Values. The core values are embedded throughout the curriculum, using cross-circular links.


The Fundamental British values

One of the resources we use in school to support this is called "Pic News", since we have started using this we have devised an acronym to help learn the British values 'I Really Do Matter'. (see below) The acronyms role is to inspire and empower our children that they all really do matter. We have a mission, to develop the pupils understanding of their own rights, their place in society and the behaviour expectations around school and the wider community.

In addition, promoting these values aims prepares our pupils for life in modern Britain. These values help to form better social and emotional understanding between pupils. So, keep quizzing your children at home with this acronym.

Within our wide curriculum planning across the school, our pupils will be building skills such as:

- Sharing their views and feelings through debates.
- Practicing mutual respect through our restorative behaviour approach.
- Learning about others faiths and beliefs driven by our R.E curriculum and celebrations through events.
- Weekly Assemblies and whole school events that promote British values, UNICEF Rights respecting school as well as the 9 protected characteristics through Pic News. One of the focusses this term has been on the 'Guinness book of records applicants.' With this we debated its importance and discussed what the pupil's entry would be to the competition. It was amazing to hear the pupil's talents (individual liberty) and their mutual respect and tolerance as we listened to ideas and debated the competitions importance.
